Turkey: Fascination with the Ancient and the Modern

Istanbul is bound on the north and the south by two seas, the Black Sea and the Sea of Marmara, respectively. The western half of the city lies in Europe while the eastern half is situated in Asia; in between the two halves flows the Bosphorus Strait. Istanbul, representing the Asian city nearest Europe and the European city closest to Asia, is a leading port whose importance is stressed by the age-old trade routes passing through the Bosphorus.

The **Blue Mosque**, one of Istanbul’s most prominent symbols, immediately astounds every visitor to the city. It is located directly opposite the Hagia Sophia Museum. The mosque takes its name from Sultanahmet Square, and is the most important of the mosques to be built as an endowment to the city during the Ottoman Empire. It was the first mosque ever to be built with six minarets.

When one thinks of Sultanahmet, **Topkapi Palace** is one of the first of its famous museums to come to mind. It is one of the world’s largest and oldest palaces still in existence today. Following its establishment in the 15th century, this magnificent and mysterious structure became the stage for every detail of the life of the Ottoman Dynasty, the rulers of the Ottoman Empire. After the declaration of the Turkish Republic, the palace was transformed into a museum. Today, a plethora of artifacts beyond all value, and without equal in the world, are still on display in its halls. Following the conquering of Istanbul, Fatih Sultan Mehmed declared the city the capital of the Empire and immediately moved the throne to the Historical Peninsula from Edirne. He commissioned the building of Topkapi Palace built on this spot in 1470. The palace is located on an area of approximately seven hundred thousand square metres, and surrounded by a wall five kilometres in length. At the time of its construction, it was the most magnificent palace ever built. Topkapi Palace functioned both as the residence of the Ottoman sultans and their families, and as the centre of the Ottoman government. All of the various Ministries of the government were located here. Additionally, the palace housed the imperial treasury, the imperial mint, the imperial archives, the advanced educational institutions of the Empire, and the special Harem of the Sultans. Topkapi Palace’s most extravagant period lasted until 1853, when the Ottoman court was moved to Dolmabahce Palace. After the establishment of the Republic, the palace was restored and turned into a museum.

The **Grand Bazaar** is one of the most interesting and authentic places in Istanbul. It was established by Fatih Sultan Mehmed immediately following the conquering of Istanbul in order to provide income for Hagia Sofia. When it was first founded, it consisted of two markets made of stone, equipped with display windows and benches. Later, the structure was capped with roofs, thereby creating the streets of the Grand Bazaar that still exist today. Its streets are covered with domed roofs; in total, it occupies an area of thirty-one-thousand square metres. Its ceilings are thirty metres high, and topped with hundreds of windowed domes. Several major consumer brands have recently opened outlets in the Grand Bazaar as well as a variety of boutique restaurants and cafes. In addition to the attraction it holds for visitors to Istanbul, the Grand Bazaar also continues to be a regular destination for residents of Istanbul themselves.

Egypt: The Birthplace of Cleopatra, Dance, & Music

What is it that makes Egypt so alluring? What magic emanates from time immemorial in Egypt? Most characteristic is the ease and friendliness in the land of friendship and love. Every visitor becomes a part of this culture and the history of its civilization. There is an ancient Egyptian proverb that says, "Whoever gazes upon the waters of the Nile will return repeatedly." A starting place to appreciate the history of ancient Egypt is the Egyptian Museum in Cairo. There are scarabs—representative of the life cycle and the durability of the human soul. The royal cartouche of King Tutankhamun portrays a scarab. Jewelry, masks, and statuary are some of the treasures of the museum.

The Aram Road out of Cairo leads to the Pyramids and the statue of the Sphinx. Behind the pyramids is the great Sahara Desert. All are entranced by their enormity and begin to contemplate the significance of man, history, time, life—the transience of human existence in their world. The Sphinx and the Pyramids always have a profound effect upon people. The Temple of Luxor occupies part of the ancient site of Thebes, the capital of Egypt at its zenith during the Middle and New Kingdoms. Today the magnificent papyrus and lotus flower columns are again resplendent. At Karnak Temple in Luxor, the great way is lined with sphinxes and can accommodate a crowd of 2,000 people. Also impressive are the obelisks at the Temple of Tutmosis I, carved from a single piece of rose granite in Aswan.

In the Valley of the Queens in the Temple of Hatshepsut are found very beautiful bas-relief paintings. In the Valley of the Kings, in the exquisitely decorated tombs, the vivid coloring has survived for thousands of years. Egypt is the land of contrasts: of the ancient with the modern, of the Blue Nile at Aswan and the lush vegetation on its banks, with the seemingly interminable sands of the Great Sahara Arabian Desert. So it is with the blend of Bedouin tribes who inhabit the deserts and by contrast the Cairenes' and their city life. In the bazaars of Cairo all the people of Egypt come to buy and sell their wares.

The Khan-el- Kahlili Bazaar has tiny winding streets, which glitter with gold, silver, and copper jewelry. Goods in the bazaar are not priced and one is expected to haggle over prices until a fair price is acceptable to both customer and merchant. Shopping is a wondrous delight and an opportunity to appreciate the people and the artifacts of their culture.

Cairo is a city of contrasts with no shortage of luxury accommodations. On El Zamalik Island in the midst of the river Nile, you leave behind you the dusty streets and enter the world of Orientale dance. Enjoy classes with Mahmoud Reda at the Balloon Theatre and tea at the top of the Cairo Tower overlooking the polo fields near the former Jezira Palace (now the Cairo Marriott Hotel). Orientale dancers perform at hotels and nightclubs in Cairo. To observe a performance in a club in Cairo is to appreciate the symmetrical beauty of the dance that is an expression of the soul of Egypt. For a dancer, a trip to Cairo is like a pilgrimage to Mecca for the devotee; and an opportunity to shop for costuming at the Cairo costume designers studios.

One of the unforgettable sounds of Egypt is the voice of the muezzin at dawn and sunset, calling forth the people to prayer. A city of one thousand minarets, Cairo has a rich Islamic heritage displayed in very beautiful architecture. The call to prayers will be with you long after your return from your journey and will bring back memories of your special experience in Egypt.

Day 1: Depart from JFK airport in New York for overnight non-stop flight to Istanbul – rest on flight and dream of Turkey while enjoying complimentary food and drink.

Day 2: Arrive in Istanbul before noon; our Turkish representative will meet and assist us at the airport. Take private bus to our hotel for check-in. Spend the rest of the day at the most magnificent shopping adventure in the world – The Grand Bazaar. We will have dinner in the area and then back to the hotel. (Trip to the bazaar is optional depending on how everyone feels after traveling.)

Day 3: After breakfast we journey to the glorious Topkapi Palace, one of the world's largest and oldest palaces still in existence today. We will lunch in the area and then visit the beautiful Blue Mosque. Dinner and shopping in the local area before returning to the hotel. Prepare for our departure in the morning.

Day 4: After breakfast, back to the Grand Bazaar for some serious shopping. Dinner in the area then back to the hotel to prepare for our departure in the morning.

Day 5: After breakfast, check out of the hotel and head to the airport. Short flight from Istanbul to Cairo, Egypt. Arrive Cairo Airport, our representative will meet and assist us for an expeditious transfer to our Hotel. After check-in we will visit Khan El Khalili bazaar to start your shopping.

Day 6: After breakfast, we meet our Tour Guide and start the day in a private air-conditioned coach by visiting one of the Seven Wonders of the World, **The Three Pyramids**, erected by Cheops, Chephren, and Mykerlonos. When you finish exploring the Great Pyramids our next stop is a visit to the **Sphinx** Monument guarding the royal burial chambers and temple of Cheops. Our last stop will be visiting the ancient churches in Old **Coptic Cairo**. We start with the Hanging church (Al-Mullaka church) built on the wall of the Greek church of St. Sergio & St. Barbara church. Then we move on to the Jewish synagogue of Ben Ezra. Back to the Hotel.

Day 7: Breakfast at the Hotel. More sightseeing, we meet our Tour Guide, and start your day in private A/C coach by visiting **The Egyptian Museum**, housing the largest collection of ancient monuments in the world, including the golden treasures of King Tutankhamen. Then, you will drive to **The Citadel of Salah El Din**, which is one of the world's greatest monuments to medieval warfare, as well as a highly visible landmark on Cairo's eastern skyline. At the end of your day tour, will go to **Khan El Khalili Bazaar**. Back to the Hotel and prepare for short flight to Luxor in the morning.

Day 8: Breakfast at the Hotel then check out from the Hotel. Our Representative will meet you at the Hotel & transfer you in Private A/C Coach to Cairo Airport to fly to Aswan. Upon Arrival to Aswan our Representative will meet you at the arrival Hall & transfer you in Private A/C Coach to your Nile Cruise. Embark on the Cruise; meet for an Orientation and Lunch. Start your tour with the **Granite Quarries**, **The Temple of Philae**, which is dedicated to the goddess Isis, & **The High Dam**. Sail to Komombo. Overnight on board. **Enjoy dinner and a possible show.**

Day 9: After Breakfast, you will visit the **Temple of Komombo**, shared by the **Two Gods Sobek & Haroeris**. Then we set sail to Edfu, (don't miss the boat!). Lunch on Board. **Enjoy dinner and a possible show.** Overnight on board.

Day 10: After Breakfast, you will visit the **Temple of Horus**. Sail to Luxor and enjoy viewing life along the Nile with lunch on Board. In the afternoon, visit the East Bank: **The Temple of Karnak**, the largest religious complex in the world, and the **Temple of Luxor** with its elegant colonnaded hall.
